

General Information and Tech help:

- **How can I get 1-on-1 tech help?**
 - Call our free hotline at 888-713-3495 to receive 1-on-1 tech assistance. The hotline is open Monday through Friday, 9am to 8pm EST and Saturday from 9am to 2pm EST.

Classes:

- **Do I have to pay for classes?**
 - No. All Senior Planet programs (online and in-person) are free of charge.
- **Do I need to be a Senior Planet member to take classes?**
 - No. There is no membership program at Senior Planet. All people age 50+ are welcome to join our programs free of charge.
- **Do you need to be a member of AARP to take Senior Planet classes?**
 - No.
- **Do I need to register for classes?**
 - For the most part, no. However, some classes and programs do require registration. Event details on seniorplanet.org will clarify if an event requires registration.
- **How can I find a list of classes being offered?**
 - Visit <https://seniorplanet.org/classes/>.
- **What is the age requirement to join programs?**
 - Anyone aged 50 or over is welcome to attend our programs. All Senior Planet curriculum is designed for older adult learners and is made with older adult input.
- **What level of tech experience is required?**
 - Senior Planet has classes for all levels! There are introductory classes for beginners and advanced classes for those with more experience. - **Are classes in-person or online?**
 - Both! You can enjoy classes virtually from the comfort of your own home or join an in-person class at one of our Senior Planet centers, at a partner site or licensed community partner. To find in-person classes near you visit <https://seniorplanet.org/locations/>

- **In what languages are Senior Planet classes offered?**
 - You can take Senior Planet classes in English, Spanish, Mandarin or Vietnamese. Some select offerings are available in Russian and Haitian Creole.
- **Do I need my own tech equipment?**
 - You need access to an internet-enabled device (desktop computer, laptop, tablet, smartphone etc.) to join Senior Planet classes online. Senior Planet does not provide tech devices to class attendees.
 - For in-person programs, devices are often provided during class, however this is not always the case. Details for each specific class will be available in the event listing on seniorplanet.org.

Online Classes:

- **Can I use a phone to join online classes?**
