
Connect a Mobile Device to WiFi


1 Locate the **WiFi symbol** It may be located in your **Settings** folder. Look for a gear icon.





Once you're inside the "Settings" folder on your mobile device, look for the WiFi symbol. It might be called "Connections." Select this option to make sure your WiFi is on.











You must have your WiFi on and join a network to access the internet.

In the image on the right, all of the networks except one require a password. Which network does not require a password?




- 4 Selecting a password protected network will bring up a screen like the image on the right. You will see the name of the network and a prompt to enter the password.
 - Many places that offer free WiFi will post the name of the network and password. If you don't see it, you can always ask!





When you have successfully connected your device to the Internet, you'll see a screen similar to this image. Notice that under the network name it says "Connected."



6 Select a browser or app on your device to begin exploring!













Some public WiFi networks do not require a password. You may be required to watch an ad or agree to terms to access the free WiFi — that's normal! However, if you're asked to provide personal information, do not move forward with joining the network!




Connect Your PC to WiFi

Locate the **WiFi symbol** in the bottom, right-hand corner of your desktop.

Click on it.


- Available networks will be listed. Any network that has the word "Secured" means that you will need a password to join that network.
- Click the network you want to join. Then click Connect if prompted.








4 Enter the password when prompted.



You'll see confirmation that you're connected to the internet.



Return to your desktop and click on the icon for your browser to begin exploring the internet!



Check WiFi on a Chromebook


The steps for connecting a Chromebook to WiFi are very similar to those for the PC. Below you'll see how to check your WiFi connection on a Chromebook.

1 Slide your finger across your trackpad until you see your pointer on the WiFi symbol, then click or tap the trackpad.



2 A small window will open.

To see all available WiFi networks, click **WiFi**. A list of all available networks will open.
