

Reviewing iPhone Privacy Settings

Check the privacy settings on your device to see what the apps on your phone can access. Some common permissions that apps request include access to your camera, contacts, gallery, location, and microphone.


1 Tap Settings to open it.



Scroll down to Privacy & Security and tap to open it.



- On the next screen, you can scroll down to review which apps can access your data and other permissions like your location, camera, etc.
 - How many apps have access to Location Services?
 - How many apps have access to Contacts?







Adjusting App Permissions

Apps require access to different parts of your phone to function properly. For example, a messaging app like WhatsApp would need access to your contacts. If you also want to share photos and location in a WhatsApp chat, you would need to give it access to your photos and location.

Let's review the apps that can access your device's location.


1 On the Privacy & Security screen, tap Location Services.



Scroll to review when the apps on your phone can access your device's location.

As you review, ask, "Does this app need to access my location?"

Tap **Chrome** to review the browsing app's location permissions.







Adjusting App Permissions, Cont'd

4 Does the Chrome app need access to location services when it's being used?


To change the permission, tap **Never** or **Ask Next Time Or When I Share**.



7 Tap the **back arrow** at the top left to review more location permissions.



- Tap the back arrow again to review other features that your apps can access, like:
 - Camera
 - Contacts
 - Photos
 - And more!



Repeat this process for as many apps and permissions as you want.
